### Term 1 – Ko Wai Tatou – Who are we?

Term 1 has been an amazing learning time for our students. They have embraced the new year and settled into learning with focus, purpose and good humour! Education Outside the Classroom (EOTC) Week was filled with new experiences outdoors and community service. Bikes in Schools, Stepping Out Road safety, Kaipatiki Educators and the Ecohub, the big trip out to Ambury Farm, Duffy Books, St John's and our first Kilikiti game against Willow Park School! Our average attendance rate this term has been 85%. This is up 6% from last years term 1, which is great. The government goal for school attendance is 90% so we are not far off reaching this goal. The next part will be encouraging consistency in attending school at 90% most of the time. Attendance matters for our children's learning for their future.

### Term 2 Class Changes

- The New Entrant and year 1 children will continue to be taught by Whaea Diane in Onewa Hapori.

All children that will have a different teacher or are moving classes will have received a notice today.

### Kilikiti Game vs. Willow Park School

Last week it was wonderful to finally see an Onepoto School Sports team leave school to play a game of Kilikiti against Willow Park School. Due to our small numbers of students, we have not been able to field a team in any sports for the past few years but with our student numbers rising we hope to see that change.



Thursday morning saw a flurry of activity as children from Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 who wanted to play Kilikiti, put on their lavalava, practiced their chants, and headed off to play. Olalini Tafoulua from Harbour Sport had coached both teams in the previous weeks and was there to oversee the game. We may have lost on runs but we won with the spirit of the game with our chants, handstands, and enthusiasm.



What really impressed teachers and supporters from both schools was the sportsmanship, encouragement and manaakitanga that was shown between both teams. Thank you to Annaliese Sina'au from Willow Park School for organising the game and to Whaea Sandra for managing the team.
